From the Pastor's Desk

Divine Visitation

God cursed the serpent the devil and among other things He said the offspring of the woman would crush the head of the serpent. (Gen 3:15) This is the text that is traditionally referred to as the *protoevangelium*; that is, the first proclamation of the Good News of salvation. The Prophet Isaiah would later speak of the virgin being with child and would bear a son and his name would be called Immanuel which means "*God is with us*". (Isaiah 7:17). The Prophet Micah, would speak of a woman in travail, who would bring forth a child. (Micah 5:3) The Israelites knew that the offspring or son of the woman referred to in all these texts and more is the Messiah who would be their Savior and the Savior of the whole humankind.

Last week we celebrated "*Gaudete*" Sunday when the church encouraged us to rejoice because our Lord is near. On this fourth and last Sunday of Advent, our first reading and gospel have one thing in common. This is the fact that from the least of the lowly clan of Judah; and from Mary the lowly handmaid, God has prepared a body for Christ, the prince of Peace. Christ according to our second reading from Hebrew assures his father for our sake: "Here I am! I am coming to do your will!" He comes soon in order to fill our hearts with his spirit of peace and joy as he did to Elizabeth and the child in her womb.



As we gradually approach the fulfillment of God's promise to us, the gospel of this Sunday presents us with the visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth. In spite of her pregnancy, Mary still found time to visit her cousin in order to share her joy and to assist her. This is a proof of her spirit of hospitality, generosity, humility, love and her faith in God who chose her. This is why she is blessed. It was not only Mary that visited Elizabeth but also, the Divine Child and Prince of peace did. Hence, this visit was divine. As we prepare to begin the year-long celebration of the 50th anniversary of the Diocese of Charlotte, let us share that joy with others by prayer, adoration and actions.

This season brethren, what we are about to have is a divine visitation and encounter with the child Jesus. This encounter will fill us with the Holy Spirit who will empower us as he empowered Elizabeth. This divine encounter with Christ will bring us transformation and it will provoke peace and greater joy in our hearts as it did for Elizabeth and the child in her womb. Let us embrace the humility of Our Blessed Mother and her Divine Child who helps us crush the actions and temptations of the ancient serpent, in our lives.

Finally, soon and very soon, we shall hear a knock at our door, and hear the voice of Mary the new ark of the covenant bearing the divine child. They are close to us. So let us dot all our "Is", and cross all our "Ts" in order to receive them, so that our joy may be complete this season. If you are yet to go for the Sacrament of Penance, this is a good time to do so, my brothers and sisters. May our coming Christmas Season be joyful. As we wait for our divine visitation and encounter this season, let us implore the Lord: "*God of hosts, bring us back; let your face shine on us and we shall be saved.*"

Desde el Escritorio del Pastor

Visitación Divina

Dios maldijo a la serpiente, el diablo y, entre otras cosas, dijo que la descendencia de la mujer aplastaría la cabeza de la serpiente. (Génesis 3:15) Este es el texto que tradicionalmente se conoce como el *protoevangelio*; es decir, el primer anuncio de la Buena Nueva de salvación. El profeta Isaías hablaría más tarde de que la virgen estaba embarazada y daría a luz un hijo y su nombre se llamaría Emmanuel, que significa "*Dios está con nosotros*". (Isaías 7:17). El profeta Miqueas hablaba de una mujer con dolores de parto, que daría a luz un hijo. (Miqueas 5: 3) Los israelitas sabían que la descendencia o el hijo de la mujer a la que se hace referencia en todos estos textos y más es el Mesías que sería su Salvador y el Salvador de toda la humanidad.

La semana pasada celebramos el domingo "*Gaudete*" cuando la iglesia nos animó a regocijarnos porque nuestro Señor está cerca. En este cuarto y último domingo de Adviento, nuestra primera lectura y el evangelio tienen algo en común. Este es el hecho de que del más pequeño del humilde clan de Judá; y de María, la humilde esclava, Dios ha preparado un cuerpo para Cristo, el Príncipe de la Paz. Cristo, según nuestra segunda lectura del hebreo, asegura a su padre por nuestro bien: "¡Aquí estoy! ¡Vengo a hacer tu voluntad!" Él viene pronto para llenar nuestros corazones con su espíritu de paz y gozo como lo hizo con Isabel y el niño en su vientre.

A medida que nos acercamos gradualmente al cumplimiento de la promesa que Dios nos hizo, el evangelio de este domingo nos presenta la visita de María a su prima Isabel. A pesar de su embarazo, María todavía encontró tiempo para visitar a su prima para compartir su alegría y ayudarla. Esta es una prueba de su espíritu de hospitalidad, generosidad, humildad, amor y su fe en Dios que la eligió. Por eso está bendecida. No fue sólo María la que visitó a Isabel, sino también el Divino Niño y Príncipe de la paz. Por tanto, esta visita fue divina. Mientras nos preparamos para comenzar la celebración de un año del 50 aniversario de la Diócesis de Charlotte, compartamos ese gozo con los demás mediante la oración, la adoración y las acciones.

Esta temporada, hermanos, lo que vamos a tener es una visitación divina y un encuentro con el niño Jesús. Este encuentro nos llenará del Espíritu Santo que nos empoderará como empoderó a Isabel. Este encuentro divino con Cristo nos transformará y provocará paz y mayor alegría en nuestros corazones como lo hizo con Isabel y el niño en su vientre. Abracemos la humildad de Nuestra Santísima Madre y su Divino Niño que nos ayuda a aplastar las acciones y tentaciones de la serpiente antigua, en nuestras vidas.

Finalmente, pronto y muy pronto, escucharemos un golpe a nuestra puerta, y escucharemos la voz de María, el arca nueva de la alianza que da a luz al niño divino. Están cerca de nosotros. Así que pongamos puntos en todos nuestros "Yoes", y crucemos todos nuestros "Yoes" para recibirlos, para que nuestra alegría sea completa en esta temporada. Si todavía tienen que ir por el Sacramento de la Penitencia, este es un buen momento para hacerlo, mis hermanos y hermanas. Que nuestra próxima temporada navideña sea alegre. Mientras esperamos nuestra visita y encuentro divinos en esta temporada, imploremos al Señor: "*Dios de los ejércitos, haznos volver; haz que tu rostro brille sobre nosotros y seremos salvos.*"
