From the Pastor's Desk

Celebrating My Baptism-Day

Last Sunday was the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. Epiphany means the revelation of Jesus to the world, as represented through the Magi who followed the Star from the East through Jerusalem to Bethlehem proclaiming the birth of the Savior. The revelation continues today with the Baptism of Jesus.

Catholic catechism teaches that Baptism is a Sacrament through which we are cleansed from original sin. Through Baptism, we become followers of Christ, children of God, and members of the Church. Some people ask, "If Baptism cleanses us from original sin, why, then, was it necessary that Jesus was baptized although he was sinless?" Maximus of Turin explains, "Christ is baptized, not that he may be sanctified in the waters, but that he himself may sanctify the waters... For when the Savior is washed, then already for our Baptism all water is cleansed and the fount purified... Christ therefore takes the lead in Baptism, so that Christian people may follow after him with confidence."



By his Baptism, Jesus incarnates himself into humanity. He fulfills all requirements of identifying with sinners. According to St. Athanasius, "He became what we are, so that he might make us what he is." We, therefore, become recipients of his incarnation by our own Baptism. Hence, the Catechism of the Catholic Church (paragraph 1272) teaches, "Incorporated into Christ by Baptism, the person baptized is configured to Christ. Baptism seals the Christian with the indelible spiritual mark (character) of his belonging to Christ. No sin can erase this mark, even if sin prevents Baptism from bearing the fruits of salvation. Given once for all, Baptism cannot be repeated."

Today's celebration reminds us of the importance of our own Baptism and baptismal promises. The baptismal promises are to reject Satan, and all his works, and all his empty promises, and to believe in God, in Jesus Christ, in the Holy Spirit, and in the Church. Today, we are invited to remember the great day we were initiated into the membership of the Church and christened as followers of Christ. We are invited to rediscover the importance of our Baptism to our journey of faith; and as we begin the new year, renew our baptismal promises, and make effort in keeping them. By this, we become God's beloved children and pleasing to him.

Today, too, we call to mind and pray for the church or parish where we were baptized, the Priest or Deacon who baptized us, our godparents, and all those who assisted in our Baptism. They all played indispensable roles at the beginning of our journey of faith. Since we do not have the tradition of celebrating Baptism-day, as we celebrate birthdays, today is a good day to celebrate our Baptism-day. And to pray for our Diocese of Charlotte as we all begin its 50th anniversary with Holy Hour and Mass this Wednesday, January 12th, by 5:30 pm and 7:00 pm respectively. May God renew the Baptismal grace in each of us. Amen!

Desde el Escritorio del Pastor

Celebrando el Día de Mi Bautismo

El pasado domingo fue la Fiesta de la Epifanía del Señor. Epifanía significa la revelación de Jesús al mundo, representada a través de los Reyes Magos que siguieron la Estrella desde Oriente a través de Jerusalén hasta Belén anunciando el nacimiento del Salvador. La revelación continúa hoy con el Bautismo de Jesús.

El catecismo católico enseña que el Bautismo es un Sacramento por el cual somos limpiados del pecado original. Por el bautismo, nos convertimos en seguidores de Cristo, hijos de Dios y miembros de la Iglesia. Algunas personas preguntan: "Si el bautismo nos limpia del pecado original, ¿por qué, entonces, era necesario que Jesús fuera bautizado a pesar de que no tenía pecado?" Máximo de Turín explica: "Cristo es bautizado, no para ser santificado en las aguas, sino para que él mismo pueda santificar las aguas... Porque cuando el Salvador es lavado, ya por nuestro Bautismo toda el agua es limpiada y la fuente purificada... Por tanto, Cristo toma la delantera en el bautismo, para que el pueblo cristiano pueda seguirlo con confianza".



Por su Bautismo, Jesús se encarna en la humanidad. Él cumple con todos los requisitos de identificación con los pecadores. Según San Atanasio, "Él se hizo lo que nosotros somos, para poder hacernos lo que él es". Nosotros, por lo tanto, nos convertimos en destinatarios de su encarnación por nuestro propio Bautismo. Por eso, el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica (párrafo 1272) enseña: "Incorporado a Cristo por el bautismo, el bautizado se configura con Cristo. El bautismo sella al cristiano con la marca espiritual indeleble (carácter) de su pertenencia a Cristo. Ningún pecado puede borrar esta marca, incluso si el pecado impide que el Bautismo dé frutos de salvación. Dado de una vez por todas, el bautismo no se puede repetir".

La celebración de hoy nos recuerda la importancia de nuestro propio Bautismo y las promesas bautismales. Las promesas bautismales son rechazar a Satanás, y todas sus obras, y todas sus promesas vacías, y creer en Dios, en Jesucristo, en el Espíritu Santo y en la Iglesia. Hoy, estamos invitados a recordar el gran día en que fuimos iniciados como miembros de la Iglesia y bautizados como seguidores de Cristo. Estamos invitados a redescubrir la importancia de nuestro Bautismo en nuestro camino de fe; y al comenzar el nuevo año, renovar nuestras promesas bautismales y esforzarnos por cumplirlas. Por esto, nos convertimos en hijos amados de Dios y agradables a él.

Hoy también recordamos y oramos por la iglesia o parroquia donde fuimos bautizados, el Sacerdote o Diácono que nos bautizó, nuestros padrinos y todos los que asistieron en nuestro Bautismo. Todos ellos jugaron papeles indispensables al comienzo de nuestro camino de fe. Como no tenemos la tradición de celebrar el día del Bautismo, como celebramos los cumpleaños, hoy es un buen día para celebrar nuestro día del Bautismo. Y orar por nuestra Diócesis de Charlotte mientras todos comenzamos su 50 aniversario con la Hora Santa y la Misa este miércoles 12 de enero a las 5:30 p. m. y 7:00 p. m. respectivamente. Que Dios renueve la gracia bautismal en cada uno de nosotros. ¡Amén!.
