From the Pastor's Desk

Requesting Masses for Special Intentions

The custom of offering Masses for specific intentions is a very ancient tradition in the Church. The Mass is the prayer of Christ and the Church. For this reason the Church considers the Mass as the greatest possible prayer of intercession as it is the perfect offering of Christ to the Father by making present the paschal mystery of his death and resurrection. We can offer Masses for various intentions of thanksgiving, anniversaries, memorials, petitions for healings and other needs. One must never forget the infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefit one's soul. Pope Leo XIII in his encyclical "Mirae Caritatis" (Wonderful Love – 1902) beautifully elaborated this point and emphasized the connection between the communion of saints with the Mass: "The grace of mutual love among the living, strengthened and increased by the sacrament of the Eucharist, flows, especially by virtue of the Sacrifice [of the Mass], to all who belong to the communion of saints. For the communion of saints is simply ... the mutual sharing of help, atonement, prayers and benefits among the faithful, those already in the heavenly fatherland, those consigned to the purifying fire, and those still making their pilgrim way here on earth. These all form one city, whose head is Christ, and whose vital principle is love. In his encyclical "Ecclesia de Eucharistia (Church of the Eucharist)," Pope St. John Paul II taught, "In the celebration of the Eucharistic Sacrifice, the Church prays that God, the Father of mercies, will grant His children the fullness of the Holy Spirit so that they may become one body and one spirit in Christ. In raising this prayer to the Father of lights, from whom comes every good endowment and every perfect gift, the Church believes that she will be heard, for she prays in union with Christ her Head and Spouse, who takes up this plea of His Bride and joins it to His own redemptive sacrifice" (No. 43).



The tradition of offering Masses for others, particularly the dead, began in the very early Church. Inscriptions discovered on tombs in Roman catacombs of the 2nd century give evidence this practice: The epitaph on the tomb of Abercius (d. 180), Bishop of Hieropolis in Phrygia, begs for prayers for the repose of his soul. Tertullian (c. 200) attested to observing the anniversary of a spouse with prayers and sacrifices, (such as the Mass): "Indeed she prays for his soul, and requests refreshment for him meanwhile, and fellowship with him in the first resurrection; and she offers her sacrifice on the anniversaries of his falling asleep" (On Monogamy, X). Moreover, the Canons of Hippolytus (c. 235) explicitly mentions the offering of prayers for the dead during the Mass. St. Cyril of Jerusalem (d. 386), in one of his many catechetical discourses, explained how at Mass both the living and dead are remembered, and how the Eucharistic Sacrifice of our Lord is of benefit to sinners, living and dead. St. Ambrose (d. 397) preached, "We have loved them during life; let us not abandon them in death, until we have conducted them by our prayers into the house of the Lord." St. John Chrysostom (d. 407) stated, "Let us help and commemorate them. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice, why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation? Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them." St. Augustine (d. 430) recorded the dying wishes of his mother, St. Monica, in his Confessions: "One thing only I ask you, that you remember me at the altar of the Lord wherever you may be." Finally, Pope St. Gregory (d. 604) said, "Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them."

The intention of the Mass is also determined by various factors: The Church may stipulate the particular intention; for example, all priests are required to offer one Mass on Sunday for the intentions of the living and deceased parishioners of a parish. A priest may also have his own particular intention in offering a Mass, such as the repose of the soul of his parents. Finally, a person may ask a priest to offer a Mass for a particular intention as mentioned above. The faithful generally make an offering, called a stipend (donation) to the priest who applies the Mass to their specific intention. This is usually given to the Parish office or put in the Mass intention envelopes (which can be found near the women's restroom). By making this offering, the faithful, by parting with something that is their own, associate themselves more intimately with Christ. The offering of a stipend is also a means whereby Catholics may contribute to the upkeep of the clergy. However, so as to avoid even the appearance of commerce in sacred things, the Church regulates the practice of receiving stipends. Thus, in normal circumstances, a priest may only accept one stipend for any one Mass even though he may offer up the Mass for several intentions. The person who has offered the stipend has not "bought a Mass", a thing which is patently impossible. What has happened is that the priest has committed himself to celebrate a Mass according to the intentions of the person making the offering. Parishioners are invited to book any of the weekday or weekend Masses for your specific or general intentions.

Desde el Escritorio del Pastor

Solicitud de Misas para Intenciones Especiales

La costumbre de ofrecer Misas por intenciones específicas es una tradición muy antigua en la Iglesia. La Misa es la oración de Cristo y de la Iglesia. Por eso la Iglesia considera la Misa como la mayor oración de intercesión posible, ya que es la ofrenda perfecta de Cristo al Padre al hacer presente el misterio pascual de su muerte y resurrección. Podemos ofrecer Misas por diversas intenciones de acción de gracias, aniversarios, memoriales, peticiones de sanación y otras necesidades. Nunca hay que olvidar las gracias infinitas que brotan del Sacrificio de la Misa que benefician el alma. El Papa León XIII en su encíclica "Mirae Caritatis" (Amor maravilloso – 1902) elaboró bellamente este punto y enfatizó la conexión entre la comunión de los santos con la Misa: "La gracia del amor mutuo entre los vivos, fortalecida y aumentada por el sacramento de la Eucaristía, fluye, especialmente en virtud del Sacrificio [de la Misa], a todos los que pertenecen a la comunión de los santos. Porque la comunión de los santos es simplemente... el mutuo compartir de la ayuda, la expiación, las oraciones y los beneficios entre los fieles, los que ya están en la patria celestial, los enviados al fuego purificador y los que todavía peregrinan aquí en la tierra. Todos estos forman una sola ciudad, cuya cabeza es Cristo, y cuyo principio vital es el amor. En su encíclica "Ecclesia de Eucharistia (Iglesia de la Eucaristía)", el Papa San Juan Pablo II enseñó: "En la celebración del Sacrificio Eucarístico, la Iglesia ora para que Dios, el Padre de las misericordias, conceda a Sus hijos la plenitud de el Espíritu Santo para que sean un solo cuerpo y un solo espíritu en Cristo. Al elevar esta oración al Padre de las luces, de quien procede toda buena dádiva y todo don perfecto, la Iglesia cree que será escuchada, porque ora en unión con Cristo, su Cabeza y Esposo, que recoge esta súplica de su Esposa y la une a su propio sacrificio redentor» (n. 43).

La tradición de ofrecer misas por los demás, particularmente por los muertos, comenzó en la Iglesia primitiva. Las inscripciones descubiertas en las tumbas de las catacumbas romanas del siglo II dan evidencia de esta práctica: El epitafio de la tumba de Abercio (m. 180), obispo de Hierópolis en Frigia, pide oraciones por el descanso de su alma. Tertuliano (c. 200) atestiguó que observaba el aniversario de un cónyuge con oraciones y sacrificios (como la Misa): "De hecho, ella ora por su alma y pide refrigerio para él mientras tanto, y comunión con él en la primera resurrección; y ella ofrece su sacrificio en los aniversarios de su sueño" (Sobre la monogamia, X). Además, los Cánones de Hipólito (c. 235) mencionan explícitamente la ofrenda de oraciones por los difuntos durante la Misa. San Cirilo de Jerusalén (m. 386), en uno de sus muchos discursos catequísticos, explicó cómo en la Misa tanto los vivos y los muertos son recordados, y cómo el Sacrificio Eucarístico de nuestro Señor beneficia a los pecadores, vivos y muertos. San Ambrosio (m. 397) predicó: "Los hemos amado durante la vida; no los abandonemos en la muerte, hasta que los hayamos conducido con nuestras oraciones a la casa del Señor". San Juan Crisóstomo (m. 407) declaró: "Ayudémoslos y conmemorémoslos. Si los hijos de Job fueron purificados por el sacrificio de su padre, ¿por qué dudaríamos de que nuestras ofrendas por los muertos les brinden algún consuelo? No dudemos en ayudar aquellos que han muerto y ofrecer nuestras oraciones por ellos". San Agustín (m. 430) registró los últimos deseos de su madre, Santa Mónica, en sus Confesiones: "Una sola cosa te pido, que me recuerdes en el altar del Señor dondequieras que estés". Finalmente, el Papa San Gregorio (m. 604) dijo: "No dudemos en ayudar a los que han muerto y ofrecer nuestras oraciones por ellos".

La intención de la Misa también está determinada por varios factores: La Iglesia puede estipular la intención particular; por ejemplo, se requiere que todos los párrocos ofrezcan una Misa el domingo por las intenciones de los feligreses vivos y fallecidos de una parroquia. Un sacerdote también puede tener su propia intención particular al ofrecer una Misa, como el descanso del alma de sus padres. Finalmente, una persona puede pedirle a un sacerdote que ofrezca una Misa por una intención particular como se mencionó anteriormente. Los fieles generalmente hacen una ofrenda, llamada estipendio (donación) al sacerdote que aplica la Misa a su intención específica. Esto generalmente se entrega a la oficina parroquial o se coloca en los sobres de intención de misa (que se pueden encontrar cerca del baño de mujeres). Al hacer esta ofrenda, los fieles, al desprenderse de algo que les es propio, se asocian más intimamente con Cristo. La ofrenda de un estipendio es también un medio por el cual los católicos pueden contribuir al mantenimiento del clero. Sin embargo, para evitar incluso la apariencia de comercio de cosas sagradas, la Iglesia regula la práctica de recibir estipendios. Por lo tanto, en circunstancias normales, un sacerdote solo puede aceptar un estipendio para cualquier Misa aunque pueda ofrecer la Misa por varias intenciones. La persona que ha ofrecido el estipendio no ha "comprado una misa", cosa que es manifiestamente imposible. Lo que ha sucedido es que el sacerdote se ha comprometido a celebrar una Misa de acuerdo con las intenciones de la persona que hace la ofrenda. Se invita a los feligreses a reservar cualquiera de las misas de lunes a viernes o de fin de semana para sus intenciones específicas o generales.
