From the Pastor's Desk

Mercy, Compassion, Patience and Generosity

In a bird's-eye view, who among the two sons was truly obedient to their father in the parable of the prodigal son? Who should win the pick? The younger or the elder son? There is a sharp contrast between the words of these two brothers to their father upon their return. Although the younger son was returning from a strayed path, but he came and pledged an unconditional obedience to his father: "I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me as one of your hired servants." (Lk 15:19). Put differently, he was saying: "I am not here to claim anything. I am only here to serve you needing nothing in return." This pledge of obedience is unconditional. It is pure because there are no incentives attached. It is service for the sake of service. Conversely, the return of the elder son from the field and his reaction towards his father uncovered something about him. He complained to his father of not being rewarded despite his long years of commitment. It was as though he stayed put serving his father because of what he would get in return and was becoming increasingly frustrated as his father wasn't yielding. This conditional obedience of the elder son is flawed and doesn't appeal to God. Conditional obedience is when we lay claim to God's mercy and favour on the ground of good actions. When we begin to think that with our good actions, we can bend God to our will.



Perhaps both attitudes towards God are represented by the two sons in our story. The younger one eventually recognize his sinfulness and "drew near" to his father in that tender moment of return. The older one's tone of voice has an edge of complaint in it if you examine it closely. Conditional versus unconditional obedience also calls to mind yesterday's gospel of the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector who went to pray in the temple in Luke 18:9-14. The tax collector and not the Pharisee went home blessed just as in today's parable, the younger son was celebrated and not the elder son.

If we are honest with ourselves, we have the heart of both sons within our own. We cycle between repentance and arrogance (or stiff indifference at best) in the spiritual life. But more poignant than that is the steadfastness of the father's character in his dealing with both the sons. It is the father's person that is the striking character in the story. What mercy and compassion are lavished on the wayward son! What patience and generosity given to the older son! And so God the Father is with us!

Why does the Church give us this familiar passage to reflect upon during this season of Lent? Perhaps, it is given to us to remind us that both sons in our story have sinned, both experience the magnanimous character of the father, and I imagine that both are changed by it as they both are welcomed into the father's house for the celebration. I can only imagine what the conversation was between these sons in the days following the party. They gave witness to each other of how they found themselves at the celebration. We are all prodigals who have left the Father's house in reality (like the younger son) or in our hearts and mind (like the older son). We all have stories of being proverbially lost and running in the wrong direction. But it helps us to be reminded that others are on the narrow path of faith as well. When we hear testimonies of how people overcame personal struggles, we are encouraged. If others can find God's mercy in their troubles, then so can we..

Desde el Escritorio del Pastor

Misericordia, Compasión, Paciencia y Generosidad

Quién de los dos hijos fue verdaderamente obediente a su padre en la parábola del hijo pródigo?" ¿Quién debería ganar la selección? ¿El hijo menor o el mayor? Hay un marcado contraste entre las palabras de estos dos hermanos a su padre a su regreso. Aunque el hijo menor regresaba de un camino extraviado, vino y juró una obediencia incondicional a su padre: "Ya no soy digno de ser llamado hijo tuyo; trátame como a uno de tus jornaleros". (Lc 15,19). Dicho de otra manera, estaba diciendo: "No estoy aquí para reclamar nada. Solo estoy aquí para servirte y no necesito nada a cambio. Este juramento de obediencia es incondicional. Es puro porque no hay incentivos adjuntos. Es el servicio por el bien del servicio. Por el contrario, el regreso del hijo mayor del campo y su reacción hacia su padre revelaron algo sobre él. Se quejó con su padre de no ser recompensado a pesar de sus largos años de compromiso. Era como si se quedara sirviendo a su padre por lo que obtendría a cambio y se sintiera cada vez más frustrado porque su padre no estaba cediendo. Esta obediencia condicional del hijo mayor es defectuosa y no atrae a Dios. La obediencia condicional es cuando reclamamos la misericordia y el favor de Dios sobre la base de buenas acciones. Cuando comenzamos a pensar que con nuestras buenas acciones, podemos doblegar a Dios a nuestra voluntad.



Quizás ambas actitudes hacia Dios estén representadas por los dos hijos de nuestra historia. El más joven finalmente reconoció su pecaminosidad y "se acercó" a su padre en ese tierno momento de regreso. El tono de voz del mayor tiene un tono de queja si lo examinas de cerca. La obediencia condicional versus la incondicional también recuerda el evangelio de ayer de la parábola del fariseo y el recaudador de impuestos que fueron a orar al templo en Lucas 18:9-14. El recaudador de impuestos y no el fariseo se fue a casa bendecido tal como en la parábola de hoy, el hijo menor fue celebrado y no el hijo mayor.

Si somos honestos con nosotros mismos, tenemos el corazón de ambos hijos dentro del nuestro. Circulamos entre el arrepentimiento y la arrogancia (o la rígida indiferencia en el mejor de los casos) en la vida espiritual. Pero más conmovedor que eso es la firmeza del carácter del padre en su trato con ambos hijos. Es la persona del padre el personaje llamativo de la historia. ¡Qué misericordia y compasión se prodigan al hijo descarriado! ¡Qué paciencia y generosidad dada al hijo mayor! ¡Y así Dios Padre está con nosotros!

¿Por qué la Iglesia nos da este pasaje familiar para reflexionar durante este tiempo de Cuaresma? Tal vez, se nos da para recordarnos que ambos hijos en nuestra historia han pecado, ambos experimentan el carácter magnánimo del padre, y me imagino que ambos son cambiados por eso, ya que ambos son bienvenidos a la casa del padre para la celebración. Solo puedo imaginar cuál fue la conversación entre estos hijos en los días posteriores a la fiesta. Se dieron testimonio unos a otros de cómo se encontraban en la celebración. Todos somos pródigos que hemos dejado la casa del Padre en la realidad (como el hijo menor) o en el corazón y la mente (como el hijo mayor). Todos tenemos historias de estar proverbialmente perdidos y corriendo en la dirección equivocada. Pero nos ayuda recordar que otros también están en el camino angosto de la fe. Cuando escuchamos testimonios de cómo las personas superaron sus luchas personales, nos animamos. Si otros pueden encontrar la misericordia de Dios en sus problemas, nosotros también podemos.


