From the Pastor's Desk

Heart of Jesus – Burning Furnace of Charity

This weekend, on the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Supreme Court of the United States overturned Roe vs. Wade. Like the blood of Abel (Genesis 4:10) the cries of the blood of millions of babies killed through the unrelenting abortion procedures have finally been heard. It must not be lost on us that five of the six Supreme Court justices who voted to overturn are Catholics. That this ruling was released on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus says a lot about how much their faith informed their judgement. We must pray for their safety and that of our churches. Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!

Devotion to the Sacred Heart began about the year 1672. On repeated occasions, Jesus appeared to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation nun, in France, and during these apparitions He explained to her the devotion to His Sacred Heart as He wanted people to practice it. He asked to be honored in the symbol of His Heart of flesh; he asked for acts of reparation, for frequent Communion, Communion on the First Friday of the month, and the keeping of the Holy Hour.



When the Catholic Church approved the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, she did not base her action only on the visions of Saint Margaret Mary. The Church approved the devotion on its own merits. There is only one Person in Jesus, and that Person was at the same time God and Man. His Heart, too, is Divine -- it is the Heart of God.

There are two things that must always be found together in the devotion to the Sacred Heart: Christ's Heart of flesh and Christ's love for us. True devotion to the Sacred Heart means devotion to the Divine Heart of Christ insofar as His Heart represents and recalls His love for us. In honoring the Heart of Christ, our homage lingers on the Person of Jesus in the fullness of His love. This love of Christ for us was the moving force of all he did and suffered for us -- in Nazareth, on the Cross, in giving Himself in the Blessed Sacrament, in His teaching and healing, in His praying and working. When we speak of the Sacred Heart, we mean Jesus showing us His Heart, Jesus all love for us and all lovable.

Jesus Christ is the incarnation of God's infinite love. The Human Nature which the Son of God took upon Himself was filled with love and kindness that has never found an equal. He is the perfect model of love of God and neighbor. Every day of His life was filled with repeated proofs of 'Christ's love that surpasses all knowledge' (Eph 3:19). Jesus handed down for all time the fundamental feature of His character: 'Take My yoke upon your shoulders and learn from Me, for I am meek and humble of Heart' (Mt 11:29). He invited all, refusing none, surprising friends and rivals by His unconditional generosity.

The meaning of love in the life of Jesus was especially evident in His sufferings. Out of love for His Father He willed to undergo the death of the Cross. 'The world must know that I love the Father and do just as the Father has commanded Me' (Jn 14:31). The love that Jesus bore toward us also urged Him to undergo the death of the Cross. At the Last Supper, He said, 'There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends' (Jn 15:13). The Heart of Jesus never ceases to love us in heaven. He sanctifies us through the Sacraments. These are inexhaustible fountains of grace and holiness which have their source in the boundless ocean of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Desde el Escritorio del Pastor

Corazón de Jesús – Horno Ardiente de la Caridad

Este fin de semana, en la Solemnidad del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús, la Corte Suprema de los Estados Unidos anuló Roe vs. Wade. Al igual que la sangre de Abel (Génesis 4:10), los gritos de la sangre de millones de bebés asesinados a través de los implacables procedimientos de aborto finalmente se han escuchado. No se debe perder que cinco de los seis jueces de la Corte Suprema que votaron para anular son católicos. Que este fallo se haya publicado en la Solemnidad del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús dice mucho sobre cuánto su fe influyó en su juicio. Debemos orar por su seguridad y la de nuestras iglesias. ¡Sagrado Corazón de Jesús, ten piedad de nosotros!

El pasado viernes (24 de junio) fue la Solemnidad del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. La devoción al Sagrado Corazón comenzó alrededor del año 1672. En repetidas ocasiones, Jesús se apareció a Santa Margarita María Alacoque, una monja de la Visitación, en Francia, y durante estas apariciones le explicó la devoción a Su Sagrado Corazón como Él quería que la gente la practicara. Eso pidió ser honrado en el símbolo de Su Corazón de carne; pidió actos de reparación, Comunión frecuente, Comunión el primer viernes de mes y la observancia de la Hora Santa.



Cuando la Iglesia Católica aprobó la devoción al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús, no basó su acción únicamente en las visiones de Santa Margarita María. La Iglesia aprobó la devoción por sus propios méritos. Hay una sola Persona en Jesús, y esa Persona era a la vez Dios y Hombre. Su Corazón también es Divino, es el Corazón de Dios.

Hay dos cosas que siempre deben encontrarse juntas en la devoción al Sagrado Corazón: el Corazón de carne de Cristo y el amor de Cristo por nosotros. La verdadera devoción al Sagrado Corazón significa devoción al Divino Corazón de Cristo en cuanto Su Corazón representa y recuerda Su amor por nosotros. Al honrar el Corazón de Cristo, nuestro homenaje se detiene en la Persona de Jesús en la plenitud de su amor. Este amor de Cristo por nosotros fue la fuerza motriz de todo lo que hizo y sufrió por nosotros: en Nazaret, en la Cruz, al darse en el Santísimo Sacramento, en Su enseñanza y sanación, en Su oración y obra. Cuando hablamos del Sagrado Corazón, nos referimos a Jesús mostrándonos Su Corazón, Jesús todo amor por nosotros y todo amable.

Jesucristo es la encarnación del amor infinito de Dios. La Naturaleza Humana que el Hijo de Dios asumió estaba llena de amor y bondad que nunca ha encontrado igual. Él es el modelo perfecto de amor a Dios y al prójimo. Cada día de su vida estuvo lleno de repetidas pruebas del 'amor de Cristo que sobrepasa todo conocimiento' (Efesios 3:19). Jesús transmitió para siempre el rasgo fundamental de su carácter: 'Llevad mi yugo sobre vuestros hombros y aprended de mí, que soy manso y humilde de corazón' (Mt 11,29). Invitó a todos, sin rechazar a ninguno, sorprendiendo a amigos y rivales con Su generosidad incondicional.

El significado del amor en la vida de Jesús fue especialmente evidente en sus sufrimientos. Por amor a su Padre quiso sufrir la muerte de la Cruz. 'El mundo debe saber que amo al Padre y hago tal como el Padre me ha mandado' (Jn 14,31). El amor que Jesús tuvo hacia nosotros también lo impulsó a sufrir la muerte de la Cruz. En la Última Cena dijo: "No hay amor más grande que el que da la vida por sus amigos" (Jn 15,13). El Corazón de Jesús nunca deja de amarnos en el cielo. Él nos santifica a través de los Sacramentos. Estas son fuentes inagotables de gracia y santidad que tienen su origen en el océano sin límites del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús.




Eucharistic Revival Begins / Comienza el Avivamiento Eucarístico
