From the Pastor's Desk

God Never Abandons Us

After nearly 50 years, the wrong decision that was made in Roe v. Wade has been set right. The Supreme Court's historic decision in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, overturning both Roe and Casey, is a watershed moment in the Church's prayer for the protection of all life from "conception to natural death". No matter how long it takes, if good men and women continue to pray and strive, evil can and will be overturned by God's grace multiplying our efforts.

Jesus continues to invite us to respond to His call for each of us to be collaborators in the work of evangelizing our communities, states, and nation. The missionary mandate of the Church has been possible due to generous men and women who pray constantly, sacrifice their time and resources towards the Church's missionary activities throughout the world. May God bless and reward such men and women of good will.

Although the world is increasingly hostile to Christian beliefs and practices, we will continue to preach the good news of God's kingdom and witness Christ whether welcomed or unwelcomed, and whether the message is accepted or not. We should remain committed to building up rather than tearing down, promoting healing and reconciliation in place of hatred, animosity and recrimination that may come our way. We are covered by the divine assurance of Jesus, "Behold, I have given you the power to tread upon serpents and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you." Many continue to recognize the impact and powerful message of the overturning of Roe v. Wade taking place on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, it reminds us that God never abandons us, He will always do His part.

July is dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus. July is usually hot and a time for relaxing. It is also the time when crops planted in the Spring are maturing and growing. Just as the crops are dependent upon summer rains not only to grow but to survive so our spiritual development is dependent upon our frequenting the sacraments and receiving the Blood of Christ.

The Blood that coursed through the veins of Christ was a part of that Sacred Humanity made possible by the maternity of Mary, whose parents, St. Joachim and St. Anne are honored this month. (July 26). Our Lord's blood poured out on the Cross purchased our salvation, washed clean the robes of the martyrs, and gave birth to the Church as it flowed from his wounded side. The Precious Blood of Christ — now pulsing through his Mystical Body — continues its salvific work, preserving and purifying, repairing and providing nourishment for regeneration and renewal of its members.

July's longer and warmer days also provide us with the opportunity for renewal, both interior and exterior. Schedules relax and pressures ease, inviting travel. But, whether we travel or not, like the missionary, St. Junipero Serra (July 1), we preach to others — by our conduct, our speech, even the clothes we wear. May we be modest in everything we do, imitating St. Maria Goretti, the young martyr for purity (July 6), and "preaching" Christ to everyone we meet. May the Precious Blood of Jesus sustain us as we journey to our true home, with Mary and the angels as our companions on the way.

Desde el Escritorio del Pastor

Dios Nunca Nos Abandona

Después de casi 50 años, la decisión equivocada que se tomó en Roe v. Wade se corrigió. La decisión histórica de la Corte Suprema en Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, que anuló tanto a Roe como a Casey, es un momento decisivo en la oración de la Iglesia por la protección de toda vida desde la "concepción hasta la muerte natural". No importa cuánto tiempo tome, si los buenos hombres y mujeres continúan orando y esforzándose, el mal puede y será derrotado por la gracia de Dios que multiplica nuestros esfuerzos.

Jesús continúa invitándonos a responder a su llamado para que cada uno de nosotros seamos colaboradores en la obra de evangelizar nuestras comunidades, estados y nación. El mandato misionero de la Iglesia ha sido posible gracias a hombres y mujeres generosos que oran constantemente, sacrifican su tiempo y recursos para las actividades misioneras de la Iglesia en todo el mundo. Que Dios bendiga y recompense a tales hombres y mujeres de buena voluntad.

Aunque el mundo es cada vez más hostil a las creencias y prácticas cristianas, continuaremos predicando las buenas nuevas del reino de Dios y testificando a Cristo, ya sea bienvenido o no, y ya sea que el mensaje sea aceptado o no. Debemos seguir comprometidos a construir en lugar de derribar, promoviendo la curación y la reconciliación en lugar del odio, la animosidad y la recriminación que puedan surgir en nuestro camino. Estamos cubiertos por la seguridad divina de Jesús: "He aquí, os he dado potestad de hollar serpientes y escorpiones, y sobre todo el ejército del enemigo, y nada os dañará". Muchos continúan reconociendo el impacto y el poderoso mensaje de la revocación de Roe v. Wade que tuvo lugar en la Solemnidad del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús, nos recuerda que Dios nunca nos abandona, Él siempre hará Su parte.

Julio está dedicado a la Preciosa Sangre de Jesús. Julio suele ser caluroso y un momento para relajarse. También es el momento en que los cultivos plantados en primavera están madurando y creciendo. Así como las cosechas dependen de las lluvias de verano no solo para crecer sino también para sobrevivir, nuestro desarrollo espiritual depende de que frecuentamos los sacramentos y recibimos la Sangre de Cristo.

La Sangre que corrió por las venas de Cristo fue parte de esa Sagrada Humanidad posibilitada por la maternidad de María, cuyos padres, San Joaquín y Santa Ana, son homenajeados este mes. (26 de julio). La sangre de nuestro Señor derramada en la Cruz compró nuestra salvación, limpió las vestiduras de los mártires y dio a luz a la Iglesia que brotó de su costado herido. La Preciosa Sangre de Cristo —pulsando ahora a través de su Cuerpo Místico— continúa su obra salvífica, preservando y purificando, reparando y alimentando para la regeneración y renovación de sus miembros.

Los días más largos y cálidos de julio también nos brindan la oportunidad de renovación, tanto interior como exterior. Los horarios se relajan y las presiones disminuyen, lo que invita a viajar. Pero, ya sea que viajemos o no, como el misionero San Junípero Serra (1 de julio), predicamos a los demás, por nuestra conducta, nuestro habla, incluso la ropa que usamos. Que seamos modestos en todo lo que hacemos, imitando a Santa María Goretti, la joven mártir de la pureza (6 de julio), y "predicando" a Cristo a todos los que nos encontramos. Que la Preciosa Sangre de Jesús nos sostenga en nuestro viaje a nuestro verdadero hogar, con María y los ángeles como nuestros compañeros en el camino.




