From the Pastor's Desk

Go and Do Likewise

Christ commanded the teacher of the law to “Go and do likewise” in today’s Gospel reading. It means ‘go and love, even your enemies, and be kind to those you meet on the road called life.’ During one of the religious Sharia riots in Northern Nigeria a couple of years ago, despite the horrendous killings and reprisals on both sides, some Muslims and Christians showed uncommon heroism and courage by defending their Christian or Muslim neighbors from deadly marauders at great risk to their persons and their families. They hid these neighbors of theirs from the other side, from those who sought their lives or harm. They are some of the modern examples of the Parable of the Good Samaritan. Christ used the ‘good Samaritan’, who was kind to someone he did not know, and should hate, as an object of His parable. So, why did Christ call the man from Samaria ‘good’? What was the genesis of the abusive and malicious relationship that spark so much animosity between the Jews and the Samaritans? This parable calls us to break these cycle of animosity by showing kindness to anybody and everybody in need.

Our neighbor’s face is different for each one of us depending upon our station in life. It can be our family members, coworkers, bosses, pastors, associates, people living on our street, those living in other lands, people on the road, and the folks in the supermarket with us, those who want to hurt us, our enemies, and those who think they can control us. They are all our neighbor. Who was the neighbor that you saw yesterday? Who did you meet today? What do they look like? What is going on in their lives? How do they make you feel? How did you respond to them?

The mistake many people make is that as important as loving our neighbor is to accomplishing God’s work, it cannot stop there. The task of discipleship is not just about bringing “love” to my neighbor in thought, word, and deed but in seeing the love that is at their source and falling in love with the author of that love, God. This love can then be brought to all of our neighbors, even those who hurt us. Love of neighbor becomes particularly challenging when our neighbors are the perpetrators of suffering, violence, and war. Jesus refers to all people, saint and sinner, as neighbor. We are asked to be a neighbor to all, without exception. How can we be a neighbor to people who hurt us or others and use violence against innocent people, especially children and the poor? It remains for each of us to honestly discern how best to compassionately and lovingly respond. Loving our neighbor is not easy. It is messy, confusing, conflicting, sticky, and uncertain. There are no easy ways to respond. We need to be attentive and listen carefully to what people need.

World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly – The fourth Sunday of July is the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly instituted by Pope Francis last year close to the memorial of SS Joachim and Anne the grandparents of Jesus. The theme chosen by the Holy Father this year is “ In old age they will still bear fruit” (Psalm 92:15) shows their value and gift both for society and Christian communities. The Church has granted a plenary indulgence for Sunday the 24th of July under the usual conditions (Sacramental Confessions, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer in accordance with the intentions of the Holy Father) for all the faithful including grandparents and the elderly who in a spirit of charity and penance, participate in the Mass of the Holy Father, or attend Mass, visit the elderly including those of them that are sick, abandoned and disabled, in person or virtually through different media. The sick elderly and those who are unable to leave home, but offer their prayers and suffering to God while the various celebrations are taking place, benefit from the plenary indulgence. Let us make time to visit and call our grandparents and the elderly on that day and many others.

Desde el Escritorio del Pastor

Ve y Haz Lo Mismo

Cristo le ordenó al maestro de la ley: "Ve y haz tú lo mismo" en la lectura del Evangelio de hoy. Significa 've y ama, incluso a tus enemigos, y sé amable con aquellos que encuentres en el camino llamado vida'. Durante uno de los disturbios religiosos de la Sharia en el norte de Nigeria hace un par de años, a pesar de los horribles asesinatos y las represalias de ambos bandos, algunos musulmanes y cristianos demostraron un heroísmo y una valentía fuera de lo común al defender a sus vecinos cristianos o musulmanes de los merodeadores mortales con gran riesgo para sus vidas, personas y sus familias. Escondieron a estos vecinos suyos del otro lado, de los que buscaban su vida o su daño. Son algunos de los ejemplos modernos de la Parábola del Buen Samaritano. Cristo usó al "buen samaritano", que fue amable con alguien que no conocía y que debería odiar, como objeto de su parábola. Entonces, ¿por qué Cristo llamó "bueno" al hombre de Samaria? ¿Cuál fue el génesis de la relación abusiva y maliciosa que suscitó tanta animosidad entre judíos y samaritanos? Esta parábola nos llama a romper este ciclo de animosidad mostrando bondad a todos y cada uno de los necesitados.

La cara de nuestro prójimo es diferente para cada uno de nosotros dependiendo de nuestra posición en la vida. Pueden ser nuestros familiares, compañeros de trabajo, jefes, pastores, asociados, la gente que vive en nuestra calle, los que viven en otras tierras, la gente en el camino, y la gente en el supermercado con nosotros, los que nos quieren hacer daño, nuestros enemigos, y aquellos que creen que pueden controlarnos. Todos son nuestro prójimo. ¿Quién era el vecino que viste ayer? ¿A quién conociste hoy? ¿Qué es lo que parecen? ¿Qué está pasando en sus vidas? Cómo te hacen sentir? ¿Cómo les respondiste?

El error que comete mucha gente es que tan importante como amar a nuestro prójimo es para llevar a cabo la obra de Dios, no puede detenerse ahí. La tarea del discipulado no se trata solo de traer "amor" a mi prójimo en pensamiento, palabra y obra, sino en ver el amor que está en su origen y enamorarse del autor de ese amor, Dios. Este amor se puede llevar a todos nuestros vecinos, incluso a aquellos que nos lastiman. El amor al prójimo se vuelve particularmente desafiante cuando nuestros vecinos son los perpetradores del sufrimiento, la violencia y la guerra. Jesús se refiere a todas las personas, santos y pecadores, como prójimos. Se nos pide que seamos prójimos de todos, sin excepción. ¿Cómo podemos ser prójimos de personas que nos lastiman a nosotros o a otros y usan la violencia contra personas inocentes, especialmente los niños y los pobres? Queda para cada uno de nosotros discernir honestamente cuál es la mejor manera de responder con compasión y amor. Amar a nuestro prójimo no es fácil. Es desordenado, confuso, conflictivo, pegajoso e incierto. No hay maneras fáciles de responder. Necesitamos estar atentos y escuchar atentamente lo que la gente necesita.

Día Mundial de los Abuelos y los Ancianos – El cuarto domingo de julio es el Día Mundial de los Abuelos y los Ancianos instituido por el Papa Francisco el año pasado cerca del memorial de SS Joaquín y Ana, los abuelos de Jesús. El tema elegido por el Santo Padre este año es "En la vejez darán fruto" (Salmo 92,15) muestra su valor y don tanto para la sociedad como para las comunidades cristianas. La Iglesia ha concedido indulgencia plenaria para el domingo 24 de julio en las condiciones habituales (confesiones sacramentales, comunión eucarística y oración según las intenciones del Santo Padre) para todos los fieles, incluidos los abuelos y los ancianos, que con espíritu de caridad y penitencia, participar en la Misa del Santo Padre, o asistir a Misa, visitar a los ancianos incluidos los enfermos, abandonados e inválidos, en persona o virtualmente a través de diferentes medios. Los ancianos enfermos y los que no pueden salir de casa, pero ofrecen sus oraciones y sufrimientos a Dios mientras se desarrollan las diversas celebraciones, se benefician de la indulgencia plenaria. Hagamos tiempo para visitar y llamar a nuestros abuelos y ancianos en ese día y muchos otros.

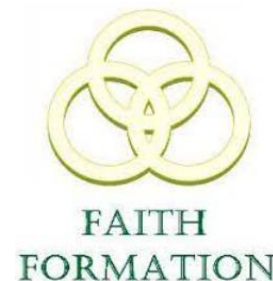

Sanctuary Course for Catholics

How can a church become a sanctuary—a place where individuals living with mental health challenges feel safe, supported, and a sense of belonging? The Sanctuary Course for Catholics was created to inspire and equip communities of faith that are asking this important question. Developed in consultation with mental health professionals, theologians, and people with lived experience, this eight-session study guide explores key mental health topics and examines meaningful ways to offer companionship, support recovery, and promote wellbeing.

The Sanctuary Course begins Sunday, July 15th,
at Donuts and Dogma (10:00 am).



The Sanctuary Course for Catholics is for anyone who wants to learn about faith and mental health. It requires no previous training or expertise—just a willingness to engage in dialogue with other believers. This course and films address difficult and sensitive topics, and may not be appropriate for a young audience. It is not recommended for people ages 17 and younger.
