From the Pastor's Desk

Be Rich in God

The word vanity can be defined as excessive attention to oneself, one's possession, one's appearance, or one's achievement. Some products that encourage self-attention are prefixed with the word 'vanity.' For example, vanity table, vanity mirror, vanity license plates, vanity surgery and so on. Vanity can further be described as self-worship, or excessive seeking of self-satisfaction. Vanity is preferring world-centered life instead of a God-centered one.

In the second reading, St. Paul names sins that result from world-centered life: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, greed, and lying. St. Paul tells us to put to death these parts of us that are earthly. The second person in the gospel was so greedy that he was unable to share his possession with others. St. Paul condemns this attitude in the following words, "Their end is destruction. Their god is their stomach; their glory is in their shame. Their minds are occupied with earthly things" (Philippians 3:19).

While we possess, grab, accumulate, bicker, and fight; let us remember Job's statement, "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked I will depart" (Job 1:21). Jesus advises us in today's gospel to be rich in God rather than storing up treasures for ourselves. The more we are rich in God, the less we store up treasures for ourselves. The deeper one's spiritual life is, the lesser one is involved in things of vanity. Therefore, we are challenged not to acquire more than we need, and to share our treasures with others. God has given enough blessings to the world. As we prepare for the Eucharistic Congress, we are called to become more like Christ who shared himself totally with us. As the saying goes, God has blessed the earth with enough for everybody's *need*, but not enough for everybody's *greed*.

Desde el Escritorio del Pastor

Ser Rico en Dios

La palabra *vanidad* se puede definir como una atención excesiva a uno mismo, la posesión, la apariencia o el logro de uno. Algunos productos que fomentan la autoatención tienen el prefijo de la palabra "tocador". Por ejemplo, mesa de tocador, espejo de tocador, matrículas de tocador, cirugía de tocador, etc. La *vanidad* puede describirse además como egoísmo o búsqueda excesiva de satisfacción propia. La *vanidad* es preferir una vida centrada en el mundo en lugar de una vida centrada en Dios.

En la segunda lectura, San Pablo nombra los pecados que resultan de una vida centrada en el mundo: inmoralidad, impureza, pasión, malos deseos, codicia y mentira. San Pablo nos dice que demos muerte a estas partes de nosotros que son terrenales. La segunda persona en el evangelio era tan codiciosa que no podía compartir su posesión con los demás. San Pablo condena esta actitud con las siguientes palabras: "Su fin es destrucción. Su dios es su estómago; su gloria está en su vergüenza. Su mente está ocupada en cosas terrenales" (Filipenses 3:19).

Mientras poseemos, agarramos, acumulamos, discutimos y luchamos; recordemos la afirmación de Job: "Desnudo salí del vientre de mi madre, y desnudo saldré" (Job 1:21). Jesús nos aconseja en el evangelio de hoy que seamos ricos en Dios en lugar de acumular tesoros para nosotros mismos. Cuanto más ricos somos en Dios, menos tesoros acumulamos para nosotros mismos. Cuanto más profunda es la vida espiritual de uno, menos se involucra uno en cosas de vanidad. Por lo tanto, tenemos el desafío de no adquirir más de lo que necesitamos y de compartir nuestros tesoros con los demás. Dios ha dado suficientes bendiciones al mundo. Mientras nos preparamos para el Congreso Eucarístico, estamos llamados a ser más como Cristo, quien se compitió totalmente con nosotros. Como dice el refrán, Dios ha bendecido la tierra con suficiente para las *necesidades* de todos, pero no para la *codicia* de todos.


Religious Education

Sanctuary Course for Catholics

How can a church become a sanctuary—a place where individuals living with mental health challenges feel safe, supported, and a sense of belonging? The Sanctuary Course for Catholics was created to inspire and equip communities of faith that are asking this important question. Developed in consultation with mental health professionals, theologians, and people with lived experience, this eight-session study guide explores key mental health topics and **examines meaningful ways to offer companionship**, support recovery, and promote wellbeing.

The Sanctuary Course continues every Sunday
at Donuts and Dogma (10:00 am).



The Sanctuary Course for Catholics is for anyone who wants to learn about faith and mental health. It requires no previous training or expertise—just a willingness to engage in dialogue with other believers. **This course and films address difficult and sensitive topics**, and may not be appropriate for a young audience. It is not recommended for people ages 17 and younger.

Our session on **August 7 will discuss the Stigma which may accompany mental illness**. In the video segment we will be meeting Simone, who lives with schizophrenia—a complex biochemical brain disorder that can impact the way a person thinks, feels, communicates, and perceives reality, and that often includes experiences of psychosis.
