From the Pastor's Desk

Eucharist at the Center

As we celebrate the Diocese of Charlotte Eucharistic Congress this weekend, the words of Pope Francis ring true, "After all, why did Jesus give us the Eucharist? He wants the Eucharist to be a real part of our life -- not just something we do once in a while" but an essential part of our lives. The Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian worship and life. Receiving the Eucharist also renews us, strengthens us he said. "Jesus is always doing new things: lifting up those who have fallen down, forgiving sins and giving us a new start, healing the wounded. There is no limit to his ability to make all things new. And in the Eucharist, he lifts us up, helps us face the anxieties and delays in our lives, calming the storms around us. He renews us, he fills us with his love, he refreshes us, he makes us new." The Eucharist invites us to deeper faith in Jesus Christ, helping us become Him whom we receive, in the midst of our joys, hopes and success, pains, sorrows, failures and disappointments. Even in the delays we encounter, the Eucharist helps us to remain a bastion of faith, hope and charity.

When God delays, faith helps us to overcome our anxieties and stress, no matter how difficult they are. As a society, we are experiencing an epidemic of anxiety and stress. Keeping up with the demands of life and the failures of has worn us out. Many of us are getting much less sleep than we need. This heightened stress takes a toll on our bodies making our blood pressure soar. We overeat and use alcohol to compensate for the pressure we feel. As we close in on ourselves, we become more isolated until we find ourselves trapped in a prison of fear.

How different our life is when we put God at the center of it, and regularly receive the Eucharist. Jesus is the Bread of life, the living water, and promised those who follow him that his yoke would be easy and his burden light (Mt 11:30). Those who live according to his teaching are no longer burdened by having to live up to the world's unrealistic expectations. We no longer measure ourselves against what others have but against the word of a merciful God who knows us, loves us and gives us His body and blood to sustain our pilgrimage journey. We who follow Jesus live in the freedom of faith. Let us ask the intercession of our Blessed Mother, Mary Mother of God as we welcome her pilgrimage statue this weekend.

Desde el Escritorio del Pastor

Eucaristía en el Centro

Mientras celebramos el Congreso Eucarístico de la Diócesis de Charlotte este fin de semana, las palabras del Papa Francisco suenan verdaderas: "Después de todo, ¿por qué Jesús nos dio la Eucaristía? Él quiere que la Eucaristía sea una parte real de nuestra vida, no solo algo que hacer de vez en cuando" sino una parte esencial de nuestras vidas. La Eucaristía es la fuente y cumbre de nuestro culto y vida cristiana. Recibir la Eucaristía también nos renueva, nos fortalece, dijo. "Jesús siempre está haciendo cosas nuevas: levantando a los caídos, perdonando los pecados y dándonos un nuevo comienzo, sanando a los heridos. No hay límite a su capacidad de hacer nuevas todas las cosas. Y en la Eucaristía, nos levanta. nos ayuda a afrontar las angustias y dilaciones de nuestra vida, calmando las tempestades que nos rodean, nos renueva, nos llena de su amor, nos refresca, nos hace nuevos". La Eucaristía nos invita a una fe más profunda en Jesucristo, ayudándonos a convertirnos en Aquel a quien recibimos, en medio de nuestras alegrías, esperanzas y éxitos, dolores, tristezas, fracasos y decepciones. Incluso en los retrasos que encontramos, la Eucaristía nos ayuda a seguir siendo un baluarte de fe, esperanza y caridad.



Cuando Dios se demora, la fe nos ayuda a superar nuestras ansiedades y tensiones, por difíciles que sean. Como sociedad, estamos viviendo una epidemia de ansiedad y estrés. Mantenernos al día con las exigencias de la vida y los fracasos nos ha agotado. Muchos de nosotros estamos durmiendo mucho menos de lo que necesitamos. Este aumento del estrés afecta nuestros cuerpos y hace que nuestra presión arterial se dispare. Comemos en exceso y usamos alcohol para compensar la presión que sentimos. A medida que nos encerramos en nosotros mismos, nos aislamos más hasta que nos encontramos atrapados en una prisión de miedo.

Qué diferente es nuestra vida cuando ponemos a Dios en el centro y recibimos regularmente la Eucaristía. Jesús es el Pan de vida, el agua viva, y prometió a los que le siguen que su yugo será suave y su carga ligera (Mt 11,30). Los que viven de acuerdo con sus enseñanzas ya no tienen la carga de tener que vivir de acuerdo con las expectativas poco realistas del mundo. Ya no nos medimos con lo que tienen los demás sino con la palabra de un Dios misericordioso que nos conoce, nos ama y nos da su cuerpo y su sangre para sostener nuestro camino de peregrinación. Los que seguimos a Jesús vivimos en la libertad de la fe. Pidamos la intercesión de nuestra Santísima Madre, María Madre de Dios, mientras damos la bienvenida a su estatua peregrina este fin de semana.


Religious Education

Sanctuary Course for Catholics

How can a church become a sanctuary—a place where individuals living with mental health challenges feel safe, supported, and a sense of belonging? The Sanctuary Course for Catholics was created to inspire and equip communities of faith that are asking this important question. Developed in consultation with mental health professionals, theologians, and people with lived experience, this eight-session study guide explores key mental health topics and **examines meaningful ways to offer companionship**, support recovery, and promote wellbeing.

The Sanctuary Course continues every Sunday
at Donuts and Dogma (10:00 am).



The Sanctuary Course for Catholics is for anyone who wants to learn about faith and mental health. It requires no previous training or expertise—just a willingness to engage in dialogue with other believers. **This course and films address difficult and sensitive topics**, and may not be appropriate for a young audience. It is not recommended for people ages 17 and younger.

Our session on **August 14 will discuss the Stigma which may accompany mental illness**. In the video segment we will be meeting Simone, who lives with schizophrenia—a complex biochemical brain disorder that can impact the way a person thinks, feels, communicates, and perceives reality, and that often includes experiences of psychosis.
