

From the Pastor's Desk

Imitate the Humility of Jesus

It is not a coincidence that the words 'humble' and 'human' are closely related. Both words are derived from the Latin word 'humus' or earth. Biology teaches us that 'humus' is the best part of the soil that makes plants grow. God made human beings from 'humus,' the best part of the soil. And human beings return to 'humus' at the end of their life span. God says to us in Genesis 3:19, "For you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Humility can be defined as devoid of pride or devoid of vanity. That is why some spiritual fathers and mothers see humility as the foundation of all virtues. According to St. Augustine, "In a soul where humility does not exist, there can be no true virtue, but mere appearance." St. Augustine also says, "If you are seeking perfection, there are three ways to reach it; first is humility, second is humility, and third is humility." St. Dominic says, "Arm yourself with prayer rather than a sword; wear humility rather than fine clothes." St. Thomas Villanova says, "Humility is the mother of many virtues. From it springs obedience, holy fear, reverence, patience, modesty, mildness, and peace." St. Thomas Villanova also says, "A humble person does not feel the insult which may be inflicted upon him or her." He or she does not dwell on it.

We may put it this way, a humble person does not retain in himself or herself insults inflicted upon him or her. When we experience prolonged anger or disturbance of soul, mind, and body due to insults from someone, no matter how close or distant that person may be, it means that the pride in us or our self-importance has retained the insults. The less proud we are or the less self-important we feel, the less we are wounded by insults, and the more forgiving we are. At the root of many un-forgiveness, misunderstandings and arguments is wounded pride or wounded self-importance. That is why Scripture says, "Where there is strife, there is pride; but wisdom is found in those who take advice" (Proverbs 13:10).

A humble person is content and detached and does not engage in unhealthy competitions and comparisons. He or she is respectful. He or she is not arrogant. He or she is forgiving. He or she does not depend on human recognition. Jesus did not depend on human testimony (John 5:34). He admonishes us, "Learn from me for I am meek and humble of heart" (Matthew 11:29). He teaches us humility when he washed the feet of his disciples. He said to them and to us, "Do you realize what I have done for you? You call me 'teacher' and 'master,' and rightly so, for indeed I am. If I, therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash one another's feet. I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do" (John 13:12-15). This is excellent humility! May God give us the grace to imitate the humility of our Lord and God Jesus Christ.

Desde el Escritorio del Pastor

Imitar la Humildad de Jesús

No es casualidad que las palabras 'humilde' y 'humano' estén estrechamente relacionadas. Ambas palabras se derivan de la palabra latina 'humus' o tierra. La biología nos enseña que el 'humus' es la mejor parte del suelo que hace crecer las plantas. Dios hizo a los seres humanos del 'humus', la mejor parte de la tierra. Y los seres humanos vuelven al 'humus' al final de su vida. Dios nos dice en Génesis 3:19: "Porque polvo eres, y al polvo volverás".

La humildad puede definirse como desprovista de orgullo o desprovista de vanidad. Por eso, algunos padres y madres espirituales ven en la humildad el fundamento de todas las virtudes. Según San Agustín, "En un alma donde no existe la humildad, no puede haber verdadera virtud, sino mera apariencia". San Agustín también dice: "Si buscas la perfección, hay tres formas de alcanzarla; primero es humildad, segundo es humildad y tercero es humildad". Santo Domingo dice: "Ármate con la oración en lugar de una espada; vistete de humildad en lugar de ropa fina". Santo Tomás Villanova dice: "La humildad es la madre de muchas virtudes. De ella brotan la obediencia, el santo temor, la reverencia, la paciencia, la modestia, la mansedumbre y la paz". Santo Tomás Villanova también dice: "Una persona humilde no siente el insulto que se le puede infligir". Él o ella no se detiene en ello.

Podemos decirlo de esta manera, una persona humilde no retiene en sí mismo los insultos que se le infligen. Cuando experimentamos una ira prolongada o una perturbación del alma, la mente y el cuerpo debido a los insultos de alguien, sin importar qué tan cerca o lejos pueda estar esa persona, significa que el orgullo en nosotros o nuestra propia importancia ha retenido los insultos. Cuanto menos orgullosos seamos o menos engreídos nos sintamos, menos nos lastimarán los insultos y más perdonaremos. En la raíz de muchas faltas de perdón, malentendidos y discusiones está el orgullo herido o la autoimportancia herida. Por eso dice la Escritura: "Donde hay contienda, hay orgullo; pero la sabiduría se encuentra en los que aceptan consejos" (Proverbios 13:10).

Una persona humilde está contenta y desapegada y no se involucra en competiciones y comparaciones malsanas. Él o ella es respetuoso. Él o ella no es arrogante. Él o ella está perdonando. Él o ella no depende del reconocimiento humano. Jesús no dependió del testimonio humano (Juan 5:34). Él nos amonesta: "Aprended de mí que soy manso y humilde de corazón" (Mateo 11:29). Nos enseña la humildad cuando lavó los pies de sus discípulos. Él les dijo a ellos y a nosotros: "¿Se dan cuenta de lo que he hecho por ustedes? Me llamas "maestro" y "maestro", y con razón, porque en verdad lo soy. Por tanto, si yo, el maestro y el maestro, os he lavado los pies, vosotros debéis lavaros los pies unos a otros. Os he dado modelo a seguir, para que como yo he hecho por vosotros, también vosotros lo hagáis" (Juan 13:12-15). ¡Esta es una excelente humildad! Que Dios nos dé la gracia de imitar la humildad de nuestro Señor y Dios Jesucristo.


