

From the Pastor's Desk

Angels: Our Allies in Heaven and on Earth

Angels are spirits without bodies, who possess superior intelligence, gigantic strength and surpassing holiness. The name angel pertains more to their duties as messengers of God's will than a description of their person. They enjoy an intimate relationship with God as His special adopted children, contemplating, loving and praising Him in heaven. Some of them are frequently sent as messengers to humans from on high. These are the archangels. Archangel means "chief messenger". angel means "messenger". We celebrated the feast of the Archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael last Thursday and the memorial of our guardian angels falls on Sunday this year, but the solemnity of the Lord's Day takes precedence. So last week and this week we celebrate the archangels and our guardians angels and continue to ask for their prayers and protection.

Michael means "Who is like God?" There is no one who can do what God can do, or claim to be God as the devil tried to do in pride. He is the archangel who defend God's friends against Satan and all his evil spirits. Holy Scripture describes St. Michael as "one of the chief princes", and as leader of the forces of heaven in their triumph over the powers of hell (Revelation 12:7-9). He has been especially honoured and invoked as patron and protector by the Church from the time of the apostles.

Gabriel means "power of God". He is God's secretary. A secretary, in the original meaning of the word, is one to whom secrets are entrusted. There was a secret hidden in the heart of God from eternity. It was God's secret to repair sin through the sacrificial death of His Son. This secret is now entrusted to the archangel Gabriel, who in turn is to reveal it to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Finally, he announced to Mary that she would bear a Son who would be conceived of the Holy Spirit, Son of the Most High and the Saviour of the world (Luke 1:26). He was also the angel who appeared to Zechariah to announce the birth of John the Baptist (Luke 1:11).

Raphael means "the healing of God". He first appeared in the book of Tobit. He acts as a guide to young Tobias on his journey to Rages, a city in the country of the Medes, east of Nineveh, to collect a debt owed his father. He binds the demon Asmodeus, helps Tobias to find a wife, recovers the debt, and heals Tobit from his blindness. He then reveals his identity. "I am Raphael, one of the seven angels who stand ready and enter before the glory of the Lord" (Tobit 12:14-15).

Angels continually intervene to protect us from danger, call us away from sin and the traps of evil and the evil one/ones. That is the role of our guardian angels and other angels. We are encouraged to listen to them. We celebrate the work they have done on our behalf and strive to follow their example of quick obedience and love for God. History is full of many stories of angelic intervention even within our modern culture. Bishop Barron talks about one of his favorite ones: "A man who was flying a single-engine plane during a severe storm. At one point, his communication system failed, and he found himself without a means to make it to the airport. Just as he was about to give up hope, a strong voice came through the radio. It gave directions to an airport the pilot knew nothing about. The voice guided him to the runway of a small airport. When he landed, he realized that the airport was abandoned. No personnel were on the ground or in the tower."

Desde el Escritorio del Pastor

Ángeles: Nuestros Aliados en el Cielo y en la Tierra

Los ángeles son espíritus sin cuerpo, que poseen una inteligencia superior, una fuerza gigantesca y una santidad incomparable. El nombre ángel se relaciona más con sus deberes como mensajeros de la voluntad de Dios que con una descripción de su persona. Disfrutan de una relación íntima con Dios como sus hijos adoptivos especiales, contemplándolo, amándolo y alabándolo en el cielo. Algunos de ellos son enviados con frecuencia como mensajeros a los humanos desde lo alto. Estos son los arcángeles. Arcángel significa "mensajero principal". Ángel significa "mensajero". Celebramos la fiesta de los Arcángeles Miguel, Gabriel y Rafael el pasado jueves y el memorial de nuestros ángeles custodios cae este año en domingo, pero prima la solemnidad del día del Señor. Así que la semana pasada y esta semana celebramos a los arcángeles y a nuestros ángeles de la guarda y seguimos pidiendo sus oraciones y protección.

Michael significa "¿Quién es como Dios?" No hay nadie que pueda hacer lo que Dios puede hacer, o pretender ser Dios como el diablo trató de hacer en su orgullo. Es el arcángel que defiende a los amigos de Dios contra Satanás y todos sus malos espíritus. La Sagrada Escritura describe a San Miguel como "uno de los principales príncipes", y como líder de las fuerzas del cielo en su triunfo sobre los poderes del infierno (Apocalipsis 12:7-9). Ha sido especialmente honrado e invocado como patrón y protector por la Iglesia desde la época de los apóstoles.

Gabriel significa "poder de Dios". Es el secretario de Dios. Un secretario, en el sentido original de la palabra, es alguien a quien se le confían secretos. Había un secreto escondido en el corazón de Dios desde la eternidad. Era el secreto de Dios reparar el pecado a través de la muerte sacrificial de Su Hijo. Este secreto está ahora confiado al arcángel Gabriel, quien a su vez lo revelará a la Santísima Virgen María. Finalmente, anunció a María que daría a luz un Hijo que sería concebido por obra del Espíritu Santo, Hijo del Altísimo y Salvador del mundo (Lc 1,26). También fue el ángel que se apareció a Zacarías para anunciar el nacimiento de Juan el Bautista (Lucas 1:11).

Rafael significa "la curación de Dios". Apareció por primera vez en el libro de Tobías. Actúa como guía del joven Tobías en su viaje a Rages, una ciudad en el país de los medos, al este de Nínive, para cobrar una deuda con su padre. Ata al demonio Asmodeo, ayuda a Tobías a encontrar esposa, recupera la deuda y cura a Tobías de su ceguera. Luego revela su identidad. "Yo soy Rafael, uno de los siete ángeles que están listos y entran ante la gloria del Señor" (Tobías 12, 14-15).

Los ángeles intervienen continuamente para protegernos del peligro, alejarnos del pecado y de las trampas del mal y de los malvados. Ese es el papel de nuestros ángeles guardianes y otros ángeles. Nos animamos a escucharlos. Celebramos el trabajo que han hecho por nosotros y nos esforzamos por seguir su ejemplo de rápida obediencia y amor a Dios. La historia está llena de muchas historias de intervención angelical incluso dentro de nuestra cultura moderna. El obispo Barron habla de uno de sus favoritos: "Un hombre que volaba un avión monomotor durante una fuerte tormenta. En un momento, su sistema de comunicación falló y se encontró sin medios para llegar al aeropuerto. Justo cuando estaba a punto de perder la esperanza, una voz fuerte llegó a través de la radio. Daba indicaciones para llegar a un aeropuerto del que el piloto no sabía nada. La voz lo guió hasta la pista de un pequeño aeropuerto. Cuando aterrizó, se dio cuenta de que el aeropuerto estaba abandonado. No había personal en tierra ni en la torre".


"No Greater Love" Movie / Película "No Hay Amor Más Grande"

Eucharistic Revival / Avivamiento Eucarístico

Eucharistic Revival isn't only about our faith in the Eucharist, it is also how God heals and revives our fragmented world. Receiving the Eucharist is meant to **introduce a radical change within a person**, giving each of us the capacity for unmeasured self-giving love. And such love heals and renews, not only persons, **but cultures too**. Of course, merely adoring or receiving the Blessed Sacrament doesn't automatically create this kind of change. **Each of us must intentionally allow this encounter to influence us**. The world needs an **army of real disciples** who actually know Jesus intimately and how to live in a deep union with him. Great things then become possible.

El mundo necesita **un ejército de verdaderos discípulos** que conozcan íntimamente a Jesús y sepan vivir en una profunda unión con él. Grandes cosas entonces se vuelven posibles.
